Paper Plate Black Cat

Materials Needed:

- Paper plates
- Black paint
- Black pipe cleaners
- Wiggle eyes
- Black pom-poms

Directions:

- 1. Paint 2 paper plates black.
- 2. Once dry, cut an arch out of the bottom of one of the paper plates. This will create the cat's body and legs.
- 3. Cut a circle, 2 small triangles, and a spooky tail out of the other paper plate.
- 4. Glue the triangles onto the circle to make the cat's head and ears.
- 5. Glue the head and tail to the body.
- 6. Glue pipe cleaners around the edge to outline the entire cat.
- 7. Glue the wiggle eyes to the cat's face.
- 8. Cut a pipe cleaner into 3 sections.
- 9. Glue the sections below the eyes to create whiskers.
- 10. Glue the black pom-pom to the center of the whiskers to make the cat's nose.



Popsicle Stick Frankenstein

Directions:

- 1. Paint 7 popsicle sticks green.
- 2. Once dry, lay the popsicle sticks side by side. Glue 2 more popsicle sticks across the back to keep the 7 green sticks in place.
- 3. Cut the ends off the last popsicle stick and cover them in silver glitter glue. Let dry.
- 4. Use the black marker to outline hair on the top part of the green popsicle sticks.
- 5. Following the outline, you just made, paint the hair black. Let dry.
- 6. Glue the wiggle eyes onto Frankenstein's face.
- 7. Glue the green pom-pom below the wiggle eyes to make his nose.
- 8. Draw on eyebrows and a wiggly smile using the black marker.
- 9. Using red glitter glue give him a few scars.
- 10. Lastly, glue the silver popsicle sticks onto the bottom of Frankenstein's head.



Materials Needed:

- 10 popsicle sticks
- Paint: green and black
- Wiggle eyes
- Pop-pom: green
- Marker
- Glitter glue: silver and red
- Glue

Oreo® Spiders

Materials Needed: Directions:

- Oreo®
- Pretzel sticks
- Candy eyes
- Candy corn
- Icing

Helpful Hint:
Double Stuf Oreo®
work best!

- Break 4 pretzel sticks in half to make the spider's 8 legs.
- 2. Push the legs into the crème on either side of the Oreo®.
- 3. Place a small amount of icing on the bottom side of 2 candy eyes.
- 4. Place the eyes on the top of the Oreo®.
- 5. Cut two candy corn in half. Keep the top half (the white point).
- 6. Push the candy corn into the crème of the Oreo® below the eyes to create fangs.
- 7. Enjoy!



Coffee Filter Monsters

Materials Needed:

- Coffee filters
- Washable markers
- Spray bottle of water
- Construction paper: white and black
- Pipe cleaners
- Glitter glue
- Glue



Directions:

- 1. Color 2 coffee filters with washable markers. You do not have to color the entire filter, there can be white spots left.
- 2. Spray the colored coffee filters with water to tie dye. Let dry.
- 3. Using one of the tie-dyed coffee filters cut out horns for your monster.
- 4. Decorate the horns as desired. You can cover them with glitter glue, wrap them in pipe cleaners, etc.
- 5. Glue the horns to the monster's head.
- 6. Using white construction paper cut out eyes for the monster. Glue a black construction paper circle to the middle of the eye. Glue to the monster's face.
- 7. Cut a mouth out of black construction paper. Glue below the eyes.
- 8. Using white construction paper cut out small triangles to make teeth. Glue the teeth to the monster's mouth.
- 9. Cut eyebrows out of the black construction paper and glue above the eyes.



Handprint Vampire

Directions:

- 1. Paint the child's fingers black and their palm skin toned.
- Press child's hand firmly onto the white paper. Remove and let dry.
- 3. Cut a large triangle out of black construction paper. This will become the collar of the vampire's cape.
- 4. Cut a slightly smaller triangle out of red construction paper. Fold the paper back and forth to give it some texture.
- 5. Glue the red folded triangle to the center of the black triangle.
- 6. On a piece of black construction paper draw the shoulders and torso of the vampire. Cut the body out.
- 7. Glue the collar of the cape to the vampire's body.
- On a white piece of construction paper cut out a rectangle.
 By cutting one end of the rectangle to a point you will create the vampire's undershirt.
- 9. Glue the undershirt to the center of the vampire's body.
- 10. When the hand-print is dry, cut it out.
- 11. Use a black marker to fill in the hairline and to draw a smile on the vampire's face.
- 12. Glue the wiggle eyes onto the face.
- 13. Cut two small triangles out of white construction paper to make fangs. Glue onto the vampire's smile.
- 14. Glue the hand-print or head onto the collar above the undershirt.
- 15. Cut a bow tie out of red construction paper and decorate as desired. You can use glitter glue, gems, buttons, etc.
- 16. When dry, glue the decorated bow tie onto the vampire's neck.

Materials Needed:

- White paper
- Construction paper;
 red, white, and black
- Black marker
- Paint black and skin-toned
- Wiggle eyes

- Glitter glue, gems, buttons, etc.
- Glue
- Scissors

Helpful Hint: Assistance from an adult will be needed for making the child's hand-print.



Toilet Paper Roll Black Cat and Mummy

Materials Needed:

- Toilet Paper Roll
- White crepe paper
- Wiggle eyes
- Glue
- Black Paint
- Black pom-poms
- Black pipe cleaners
- Scissors

Helpful Hint: You may need to layer when wrapping so that you cannot see the roll underneath the streamer.

Black Cat Directions:

- 1. Paint the toilet paper roll black.
- Once dry, fold the top of the roll in and glue to create the ears.
- 3. Glue the wiggle eyes onto the cat's face.
- Cut a pipe cleaner into 3 short sections. Glue below the eyes.
 This will create the whiskers.
- 5. Glue the pom-pom onto the middle of the whiskers to make a nose.
- Bend a pipe cleaner to create a spooky tail.Glue onto the back of the roll.



Mummy Directions:

- 1. Glue the end of the crepe paper to the back of the toilet paper roll.
- 2. Wrap the crepe paper around until about ¾ of the roll is covered.
- 3. Glue on the wiggle eyes.
- 4. Glue the end of the crepe paper to the back of the roll again.

 This time start ¾ of the way up the roll so that the rest can be covered.
- 5. Wrap the crepe paper around the roll, slightly covering the wiggle eyes.
- 6. Once the whole roll is covered, glue the end of the crepe paper to the back of the mummy.

Helpful Hint: A glue gun makes gluing on pipe cleaners easier, but always have an adult operate the glue gun.

Button Ghost



Materials Needed:

- Construction Paper: orange and black
- Buttons: white and3 black
- Glue
- Pencil

Directions:

- 1. Glue the black paper onto the orange paper.
- 2. Using the pencil, draw the outline of the ghost onto the black paper.
- 3. Begin gluing white buttons onto the black paper filling in the outline you drew.
- 4. Continue layering the buttons until you can no longer see the black paper underneath.
- 5. Use 3 black buttons to create the ghost's face.

Spider Ring



Directions:

- Glue the small pom-pom onto the medium pom-pom to make the spider's head and body.
- 2. Cut a pipe cleaner into 4 medium-sized sections.
- 3. Bend the 4 sections into a "M" shape.
- 4. Glue the spider's body onto the middle of the four "M's". This will create the spider's creepy-crawly legs.
- 5. Wrap a pipe cleaner around the child's finger to create the ring.

6. Glue the ring to the bottom of the spider.

Helpful Hint: Hot glue works best, but always have an adult operate the glue gun.



Pumpkin Rice Krispie Treats



Materials Needed:

- Butter
- Marshmallows
- Rice Krispies™ Cereal
- Food Coloring: orange or yellow and red
- Tootsie Rolls®
- M&M's®

(only need the green ones)

Directions:

- 1. Melt 3 tablespoons of butter and 4 cups of marshmallows in a large bowl. Microwave for 3 minutes, taking out to stir after 2 minutes.
- 2. Stir in 3 drops of orange food coloring. If using red and yellow food coloring, use 2 drops of yellow and 1 drop of red.
- 3. Stir in 6 cups of Rice Krispies™ cereal.
- 4. Once mixed thoroughly, form into balls and place onto a tray.
- 5. Push a Tootsie Roll® into the top of each ball. This will be the stem of the pumpkin.
- 6. Place a green M&M's® next to the Tootsie Roll® as a leaf.
- 7. Place the finished pumpkins into the fridge to cool.
- 8. Enjoy!

Helpful Hint: To keep from sticking to your hands when forming into balls, cover your hands with butter!

Popsicle Stick Scarecrow

Directions:

- 1. Lay 7 popsicle sticks side-by-side. Glue 2 popsicle sticks across the back to keep the 7 popsicle sticks in place.
- 2. Paint the top of the 7 popsicle sticks orange to make the scarecrow's hat.
- 3. Paint another popsicle stick orange.
- 4. Cut 6 strands of burlap ribbon. Taking 3 strands, braid the ribbon. Repeat on the other 3 strands.
- 5. Using the black ribbon, secure the end of each braid.
- 6. Glue the braid to the hat.
- 7. Glue the orange painted popsicle stick to the bottom of the hat, covering the top of the braids.
- 8. Paint the ends of the 3 remaining popsicle sticks yellow.
- 9. Once dry, cut the yellow ends off.
- 10. Glue the ends together to form a flower.
- 11. Glue the pom-pom to the middle of the flower.
- 12. Glue the flower to the scarecrow's hat.
- 13. Glue the wiggle eyes to the scarecrow's face.
- 14. Using glitter glue, draw a triangle nose below the eyes.
- Draw a stitched-on smile with a black marker.
- Draw on blushed cheeks with a red or pink crayon

Materials Needed:

- 13 popsicle sticks
- Paint: yellow and orange
- Black pom-pom
- Wiggle eyes
- Ribbon: burlap and black
- Glitter glue
- Marker
- Crayon: red or pink
- Glue



Yarn Spiderweb

Spiderweb Directions:

- 1. Paint the popsicle sticks white.
- 2. Once dry, decorate with glitter glue. Let dry.
- 3. Glue the 3 popsicle sticks together crossing them in the middle.
- 4. Tie the white yarn to the center of the popsicle sticks,
- 5. Begin wrapping the yarn around each popsicle stick.
- 6. Glue the yarn down when you get to the edge of the spider web.

Materials Needed:

- Pom-poms: Medium and small
- Pipe cleaners
- 3 popsicle sticks
- White paint
- White yarn
- Glitter glue
- Glue

Spider Directions:

1. Glue the small pom-pom onto the medium pom-pom to make the spider's head and body.

2. Cut a pipe cleaner into 4 medium sized sections.

4. Glue the spider's body onto the middle of the four "M's". This will create the spider's creepy-crawly legs.

5. Glue the spider onto the spiderweb.
